Interact respectfully, & meaningfully



DCE – an ongoing process that begins in the cradle








Reference Framework for a Democratic Culture

1 in 5 show them how to use social networks




Less than 50% of parents say they know their children's online friends

Access and inclusion -

enjoy equal access to online opportunities.

Learning and creativity –

lifelong learners, knowing how to use digital tools creatively.

Media and information literacy – critically understand, interpret and use digital technology.

Well-being Online

Active participation –

play an active role in on/offline communities.

Rights and responsibilities -

know, understand and defend our rights, respect our responsibilities.

Etika in empatija

e-prisotnost in komunikacije

Otroci imajo pravico do zaščite pred vsemi oblikami fizičnega in duševnega nasilja in trpinčenja ter kakršno koli obliko izkoriščanja, ki bi lahko ogrozila njihovo zdravje ali blaginjo.

Razvijanje zaupanja vrednega odnosa z otroki jih bo spodbudilo, da vam zaupajo, ko gre kaj narobe. Z vami kot varnostno mrežo, bodo zgradili odpornost in se lahko poberejo po boleči izkušnji (kot ie ustrahovanie).

e-prisotnost in komunikacije

Otroci imajo pravico do zaščite pred napadi na njihovo dobro počutje in ugled.

- Pogovorite se s svojimi otroki o etični in odgovorni uporabi interneta ter o uporabi enakih pravil lepega vedenja na spletu in zunaj njega.
- Opomnite jih, da vse, kar počnejo na spletu, pušča digitalni odtis, ki bo pomagal oblikovati njihov ugled in morda prihodnost.



Engaging parents, empowering children

- Messaging must be clear, sticky, understandable to children & parents
- > Parental controls are conversations stoppers rather than starters
