








Digitalisation of the curriculum


Figure 5: Extent of curriculum digitisation



Mobile phones in school

In most countries surveyed: pupils may sometimes use them if the teacher allows in others, not at all: Greece, Malta, Norway (primary only), Spain In no country may pupils use their mobile phone whenever they want Outside lessons during the school day: it's a school level decision


Figure 6: Are pupils allowed to use their own smartphone, tablet or laptop in lessons? (n=17)

Malta: Quantify screen time in schools


Reaction of parents and pupils
